The **NURSE PRACTITIONER** (NP) functions in an expanded role demonstrating a high level of autonomy and expert skill to manage the care required to successfully transition patients and donors through the allogeneic transplant pathway.

Principal responsibilities include utilizing and demonstrating a comprehensive theoretical knowledge base and advanced level of clinical competence in caring for malignant hematology patients. This will involve collecting and interpreting data about the health of the patient, determining a medical diagnosis and treating complex responses of individuals and families to actual or potential problems.

The Nurse Practitioner is an integral member of the Transplant team having specific role responsibilities for the coordination, education and preparation of Allogeneic BM/PBSC transplant candidates and donors. The NP in collaboration with the inter-professional team will facilitate the outcomes of care for the transplant population by assessing, analyzing and synthesizing clinical findings which result in the optimum achievement of patient care and program goals in a quality and cost-effective manner

Other responsibilities include performing research activities; delivering, coordinating and participating in education and professional development activities/programs; and performing activities to further develop and strengthen the nursing profession.

Up to five (5) years of relevant experience; including three (3) years experience working in the transplant setting required
